**COMCAST SPORTSNET TO AIR 2010 TD BANK PHILADELPHIA INTERNATIONAL CYCLING
CHAMPIONSHIP ON SUNDAY JUNE 6**

***Comcast SportsNet's Coverage Features Preview Specials, Local Cyclist Profiles
and Classic Race Memories***

PHILADELPHIA (May 25, 2010) – Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia will air the most comprehensive coverage of the 2010 TD Bank Philadelphia International Cycling Championship in the event's history. Former international cyclist Jessica Grieco-Casey will report on the riders' experience live from an on-course motorcycle. The race is known for attracting a large crowd of energetic and passionate cycling fans and Comcast SportsNet's Marshall Harris will cover the pulse of the fans throughout the day. Murphy and Eustice will host Comcast SportsNet's coverage live from a special race-day set atop the Benjamin Franklin Parkway. Comcast SportsNet's coverage will utilize multiple on-course cameras, a helicopter gyro cam and two motorcycle-mounted cameras.
